

FLASHING YELLOW ARROW



WHAT: Flashing yellow arrow signals are being installed at intersections throughout the state. The signal helps clarify to motorists to yield to oncoming traffic when turning left.

WHY: Flashing yellow arrow signals reduce crashes involving left-turning vehicles while keeping traffic flowing smoothly through intersections.

HOW: When you see a flashing yellow arrow at an intersection where you want to make a left turn, simply:

- ◀ **Slow down**
- ◀ **Yield** to oncoming traffic, bicyclists and pedestrians
- ◀ **Turn left**, proceed with caution

WHAT THE ARROWS MEAN



STEADY RED ARROW

- Drivers must STOP



STEADY YELLOW ARROW

- Signal is preparing to turn red
- Drivers should prepare to stop



FLASHING YELLOW ARROW

- Left turns allowed provided there is a safe gap in vehicle and pedestrian traffic



STEADY GREEN ARROW

- Permitted left turn
- Drivers to yield to pedestrians within the adjacent crosswalk

THE MORE YOU KNOW

- The flashing yellow arrow is followed by a steady yellow arrow, or a steady green arrow, never by a red light. This allows motorists to anticipate when a flashing yellow arrow will turn red.
