Distracted Drivers:

Distracted driving includes anything that diverts the driver's attention away from the primary task of driving.

☐ Text while Driving
☐ Use a Cell/Smart Phone (including handheld and hands-free devices) while Driving
☐ Read or Post on Social Media or Email while Driving
☐ Eat or Drink while Driving
☐ Manage a GPS or other navigation system while Driving
☐ Put on Makeup/Groom while Driving
Research shows that distracted drivers exhibit a greater level of impairmen than drivers who are legally intoxicated. <i>Get rid of the distractions.</i>

Distracted Pedestrians:

- Walk Slower/Take longer to Cross
- Are less likely to pay attention to pedestrian signals
- Are more likely to walk in front of an approaching vehicle
- Are less likely to see objects in their path, including other pedestrians
- Are more likely to veer off course

Studies reflect that pedestrian injuries due to cell phone use alone are up 35% since 2010. It's predicted those numbers are on the rise. *Are YOU a distracted pedestrian? Get rid of the distractions.*
